### **3. Background/Rationale**

As a syllabus provides a framework for the assessment of teacher and learner achievement, it is an inseparable part of the course of the study. It also specifies the work in course setting and it is a summary of the curriculum also.

With a perspective to enable the students to acquire a reasonable degree of language proficiency in Manipuri, the framework for the assessment of teacher and learner achievement has been prepared. The course will aim, mainly at promoting the higher order language skills. By the time the students completed the higher secondary level, i.e. Class XII, they are expected to achieve the skills for text-based writing, able to write formal/informal letters and applications for different purposes, grammatical rules of Manipuri language, etc.

After the completion of the course, a large number of students are going to pursue for the graduation courses in the respective subject, and they should be well-prepared for this. A reasonable degree of proficiency in the relevant subject is very much needed for the higher-up studies. Thus, the course will mainly give focus on the required language skills for the academic study.

### **4. Learning objectives**

The main learning objectives in this stage are:

- To achieve greater knowledge and proficiency in the use of language skills necessary both for the social and academic purposes.
- To develop basic skill and new ideas by introducing the text-based answers of the unseen passages.
- To improve their communication, social and handwriting skills and to understand the meaning of Phrase and Idioms.
- To identify different word and understand compose examples of grammar elements.
- To identify literary techniques and creative uses of language in literary text. To identify the central/main points and supporting details, etc.
- To achieve the advanced language skills with an aim to develop the skills of reasoning, drawing inferences through meaningful activities.
- To develop the capacity to appreciate literary use of Manipuri and also use Manipuri creatively and imaginatively.
